BamBam will need a foster spot this week.






MONKEY | ADULT

Oscar is a sweet boy whose favorite activities are eating, snuggling on the couch, and taking slow-paced walks. He is good with other dogs — he does not even react to the poorly behaved ones! Oscar is OK with small dogs, but he may play too rough for some. Oscar enjoys meeting children during walks through the neighborhood, and we think he would be great with kids because he is very patient and gentle aside from occasionally stepping all over you while attempting to snuggle. Oscar seems most concerned with being with his people so we think he would be happiest in a home where he does not spend a lot of time alone.
